

**TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF VARIOUS STREETS IN DORCHESTER FOR CHRISTMAS
CRACKER EVENT, 7th DECEMBER 2017****TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF THROUGH ROAD WAITING OR LOADING AND UNLOADING**

For the purpose of Dorchester Christmas Cracker, DORSET COUNTY COUNCIL has issued a Notice under Section 16A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 to prohibit the use of the following streets in Dorchester by cyclists, horse riders and all mechanically propelled vehicles, except those taking part in the event and emergency vehicles on Thursday, 7th December 2017 between 16.45 hrs and 21.00 hrs:-

High West Street, South Street and New Street

High East Street – The Bow to Church Street Junction

Durngate Street – South Street to Church Street Junction

Trinity Street – Princes Street Junction to High West Street Junction (Access to Trinity Street will be maintained at all times. However, traffic will be diverted west at its junction with Princes Street onto Albert Road and can disperse from there).

Access to North Square and beyond will be available via High East Street only and vehicles will be escorted through the street at walking pace. Traffic wishing to exit from North Square may do so via Friary Lane.

Alternative route which will be sign posted at all times.

From Top O' Town Roundabout proceed southward along Albert Road and Cornwall Road, straight ahead through the traffic signals. Turn left into Upper Fairfield Road and left on to Weymouth Avenue; follow the road on to South Walks Road to the traffic signals at the junction with Acland Road. Turn left into Acland Road and proceed northward to the junction with High East Street.
